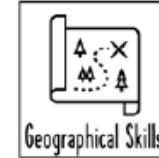


## Weaving Concepts

### VOCABULARY

|                     |   |

| Equator             | A line drawn horizontally on the Earth dividing the Earth into Northern and Southern Hemispheres. |
| Tropic of Cancer    | One of the five major circles of latitude.  |
| Tropic of Capricorn | One of the five major circles of latitude.  |
| Greenwich Mean Time | The main time form in several countries, including the UK.  |



- A capital city is a city or town that has been chosen as the leading city of a country.
- It is often where the government of a country is based.
- Lots of countries leaders and officials do their work in the capital city.
- Often, capital cities are the largest city in their country (e.g. London.) However, this is not always the case (e.g. Ontario in Canada.)
