




WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

At the top and bottom of the Earth are the poles.



Places near the Equator are hot.

Places near the North and South Pole are cold.



What will I learn?

- Atlases and globes help us to find different countries and continents.
- There are seven continents:
 - Asia, Africa, North American, South America, Antarctica, Europe, Australia.
- There are five oceans: Arctic Ocean. Southern Ocean, Indian Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Pacific Ocean.

World	The earth, together with all of its countries and people.	
Continent	Large solid area of land. (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South	
	America, Australia, Antarctica).	
Equator	Imaginary line around the middle of the Earth.	

Globe	A sphere model of the Earth, on which a map of the world is drawn.
Ocean	A large expanse of sea
North/South Pole	Two points on Earth's surface that are furthest away from equator.
