- I know that the Christian holy book is called 'The Bible'.

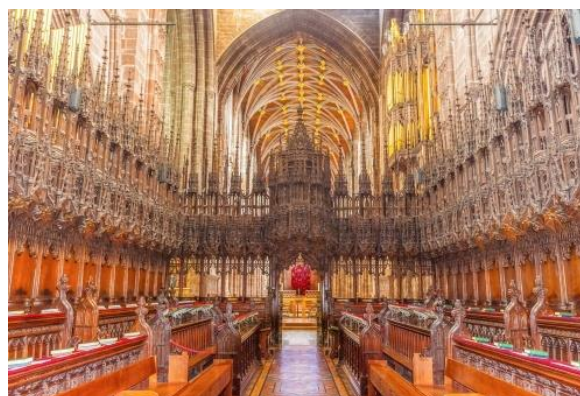


Vocabulary

Mitre – A tall headress worn by Bishops.

Bishop – A senior member of the Christian clergy, usually in charge of a diocese and empowered to confer holy orders.

Cathedral – a church that is the official seat of diocesan bishop.



What am I going to learn?

- Cathedrals are the mother churches of their dioceses and act as focal points for services and celebrations for those worshipping churches throughout the diocese.
