



Significant Nurses

Mary Seacole was a Jamaican nurse who set up a hospital called the British Hotel to look after soldiers during the Crimean war.

She wrote a book called the The Wonderful Adventures of Mrs.
Seacole in Many Lands which tells us abut her life.

After she died, people forgot about her



Florence Nightingale looked after injured soldiers during the Crimean War.

The hospitals were dirty and full of disease. Florence made sure they were clean and that soldiers had the correct medicine.

After the war she set up a training school for nurses.

She was awarded a medal by Queen Victoria.



Edith Cavell trained as a nurse in England and was then asked to be in charge of a nurse training school in Belgium.

When WWI broke out she worked at a hospital in Belgium where she treated soldiers from both sides.

She also hid over 200 soldiers from the Germans.

The Germans arrested her for treason and sentenced her to death.
