What will I learn?

I will learn to play and read the **notes** C, D, E + F on the glockenspiel. I will develop my skills, holding the beater and hitting the metal keys in the centre. I may also play pieces on the recorder and compare the **timbre**.

I will learn to play some of these tunes:

- Easy E Strictly D Play Your Music Drive Dee Cee's Blues What's Up
- \bullet D-E-F-initely \bullet Roundabout \bullet March of the Golden Guards \bullet Portsmouth

I will improvise with Dee Cee's Blues using the notes C + D.

I will decide how to introduce a performance. Tell the audience how I learnt the music and why. Record the performance and then talk about it afterwards, using the **interrelated dimensions** of music.

VOCABULARY

Notation

Notation-	ways to visually represent music.
Stave-	the collection of lines onto which notes are placed on a musical score. Each stave comprises five lines, creating four spaces in between them.
Timbre-	all instruments, including voices, have a certain sound quality e.g. the trumpet has a very different sound quality to the violin.

Vocabulary: Improvise, pulse, rhythm, pitch, tempo, dynamics, texture, structure, melody.
